

About the BMLA: Black Male Leadership Academy

Roosevelt University, through the St. Clair Drake Center for African and African American Studies, launched the Black Male Leadership Academy program in the summer of 2014 through the generous support of the Efroymsen Family Fund and Robert and Rose Johnson. Mr. Johnson is a Roosevelt graduate and first African-American executive at Sears Roebuck and Company.

The students selected for this experience will include 15 rising high school sophomores and 15 rising high school juniors. The BMLA has two components: the Summer Institute and Second Saturdays. The Summer Institute provides a week-long experience from **June to August** (please refer to the application for the dates of the current program for 2025), for 30 African American males to live on Roosevelt's downtown Chicago Campus. Second Saturdays will provide graduates of the Summer Institute with a wide range of college-readiness experiences.

The Summer Institute will focus on developing intellectual, personal and leadership skills and enhancing students' exposure to university life. Students will spend time inside the classroom as well as in the community. Each day during the institute, students will attend classes, participate in leadership development activities, and create connections with community leaders.

During the school year, graduates of the Summer Institute will attend a once a month meeting called Second Saturdays, which takes place the second Saturday of each month from September through April. The purpose of Second Saturdays is to continue a connection with the BMLA students and enhance their awareness of and preparation for college. These half-day sessions will be devoted to tutoring, mentoring, field trips and guest speakers. Topics and activities will include career development, mentoring, applying to college, financial aid, ACT preparation, and tutoring.

If you meet the following criteria, we encourage you to apply:

- You will be a high school sophomore or junior in the fall.
- You have a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 out of 4.0 or higher.
- You have at least a 90% attendance rate at your high school.
- You can commit to attending an overnight program for one week over the summer and attending meetings once a month at the downtown Chicago Campus of Roosevelt University.
- You plan to attend college after you graduate from high school.
- You are interested in learning about a variety of topics while having fun, meeting new people, and enhancing your leadership skills.

BMLA Summer Institute Schedule

Each day of the Summer Institute will feature different topics and activities. Below is a sample schedule for each day:

7:30-9 a.m. – Breakfast

Students will eat in the dining center inside the university's 32-story Wabash Building. The Wabash Building is the second tallest university building in the United States and features student housing on the top 17 floors. Summer Institute participants will stay in the Wabash Building during the week.

9 a.m.-12 p.m. – Class time

Class topics will range from African-American studies to college readiness.

12-1 p.m. – Lunch

1-4 p.m. – City excursions

Trips off campus will range from visits to museums to Chicago White Sox home game.

4-5:30 p.m. – Dinner and free time

Students will use this time to prepare for class the next day.

6-9 p.m. – Evening activities

Events will include leadership training, movies, and open gym time in the university's Goodman Center, the only university athletic facility in downtown Chicago.

9-11 p.m. – Free time

Students will have time to work on projects, relax, and enjoy the residence hall experience.

11 p.m. – Curfew and lights out
